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OBJECTS OF THE ANN SINCLAIR CHARITABLE TRUST

The Trust document provides for funds to be invested by the Trustee and the income used for :-

- "(a) the assistance with their travel to, accommodation and education in any aspects of farming including agriculture, horticulture, orcharding and animal husbandry, both general and specialised, at what the Trustee in its discretion considers to be suitable places and educational institutes (including, but not in any way limiting the discretion of the Trustee, universities, polytechnics, farm training institutes and schools) whether within or without New Zealand, of the following classes of students, priority being given in any one year to the classes in the order set out below as funds permit :
- (i) students who want to be trained in farming and would be likely to benefit from such training and have a need for assistance on account of the unsuitability of their existing environment, financial hardship or their state of health;
 - (ii) students who for other good reason would otherwise not readily have the opportunity to undertake such studies;
 - (iii) students who, in the opinion of and at the unfettered discretion of the Trustee would find benefit from such assistance.
- "(b) provide funds by way of grant to farm training institutions which are willing to take students who would fall within the criteria laid down in the foregoing object 1 (a)(i) for the general or special purpose or purposes of such institutions as the Trustee in its discretion considers expedient.
- "(c) to establish and/or conduct and/or provide financial assistance to any person or organisation establishing and/or conducting camps either permanent or temporary for the use of Bible Classes, Youth Groups, Children's Homes and other organised bodies belonging to any Christian denomination for holidays and/or retreats. Grants will not be made for the purchase of capital items."

Applications close 31st October each and every year.

GRANT GUIDELINES

The following criteria should be taken into account when applying for funding from the Ann Sinclair Charitable Trust:

Category A – Students studying Agriculture, Horticulture, Orchardng and Animal Husbandry

- Grants will only be given to students living in the PSC area (Wellington, Wairarapa, Manawatu, Taranaki and Wanganui areas). Applications from students living outside of the PSC area may be considered by the trustees if these applications show special need or exceptional financial or family circumstances.
- The approval of a grant for one year carries no presumption as to the availability of any future grant.
- Tertiary Grants will be payable upon receipt of a letter from the relevant Institution setting out a list of subjects for which the applicant has enrolled and also receipt of confirmation from the Dean of the Faculty or similar senior person at the Institution that the applicant has begun his course.
- Tertiary grants may be approved for an amount of up to \$10,000 per applicant.
- A Grant Evaluation Form (provided on approval of grant) must be completed and returned by 31st October of the same year the grant was received.

Category B – Farm Training Institutions

- Grants will not be given for the purchase of capital items.
- The approval of a grant for one year carries no presumption as to the availability of any future grant.

Category C – Persons or Organisations Establishing and/or Conducting Christian Camps

- Grants will only be given to Christian youth camping events where participants come from within the PSC area (Wellington, Wairarapa, Manawatu, Taranaki and Wanganui areas).
- Grants will not be given for the purchase of capital items.
- Grants are to be used for the approved purpose only. The approval of a grant for one year carries no presumption as to the availability of any future grant.
- Camp grants may be approved for an amount of up to \$20,000 per application.
- Preference is given to organisations who intend subsidising participants to attend a camp rather than providing 100% funding to attendees.
- A Grant Evaluation Form (provided on approval of grant) must be completed and returned by 31st October of the same year the grant was received.
